

While co-managing this multicultural Design-Development Team in Norwich, England he received two GM President's Awards for exceptional performance in global team building and achieving world class quality upon launch of the Global L4 Engine. Jay retired in 2009 as Assistant Chief Engineer at GM Powertrain headquarters and moved with his wife to Gilbert, AZ where he currently lives close to his daughter's family.

Asha attended Davars College of Commerce, Mumbai, Maharashtra where she earned an Associate Degree in Secretarial Services. First and foremost, Asha was a home maker. Then, spent 16 years at Delphi Automotive in Troy, Michigan holding various positions in their Purchasing Department. Before she retired in 2008, she was heading Delphi's Purchasing Process Coordination.

By far, Asha's most memorable events revolve around the successful rearing of their children resulting in their outstanding career achievements and becoming a grandparent in 2009. Her hobbies include reading, music and culinary experimentations for perfecting recipes.

NEW MEMBERS- BILL & MOLLY TODD



Bill was born and raised in Lorain, Ohio. The first 20 years of Bill's 45 year career with GM was spent in direct manufacturing engineering as a tool and production engineer. He started at the Brown-Lipe-Chapin (BLC) Division immediately after high school graduation as a GMI Co-OP student and earned a Bachelor's Degree in Mechanical Engineering from General Motors Institute in 1959. The BLC Division was located in Elyria, Ohio where he honed his skills in tool design, production engineering and productivity increases in zinc die casting.

From 1966 to 1974 it was on to the Ternstedt and Fisher Body Division in Warren,

MI acting as a Senior Tool and Production Engineer for injection molding operations at the Syracuse, N.Y., Elyria, OH and Detroit, MI plants. In 1974-1988 he worked with the Advanced Engineering /Manufacturing Development Staff as an Engineering Supervisor for Sheet Molding Compound development. In 1988 - 1994 the Advanced Engineering Staff matrixed Bill to the C5 Corvette Program to ensure the latest manufacturing technology was implemented. Exterior Body Panel processing and hydro formed rails for the main structure as well as high quality SMC body panel support were his focus.

Bill's final six years before retiring in 1999 were spent with the Advanced Engineering Staff - Small Car Program and his final position before retirement was with the GM Research and Development Staff as a Staff Engineer representing GM Product and Manufacturing in Partnership with Executive Engineers from Ford and Chrysler on the Partnership for the Next Generation of Vehicles.

Bill's most memorable accomplishment at GM is when he developed and put into production stainless steel body side moldings with injection molded rub strips, molded directly into the stainless moldings in a massive insert molding project for Pontiac and Chevrolet. Adhesives had not been developed for the application yet so the only alternative was a molded interlock of plastic and steel. Other significant engineering group accomplishments included;

a.) Development of electronic controls for compression molding presses and implemented in-mold coating for Sheet Molding Compound body panels, which was a major quality improvement. Patent issued. b.) Developed and supplied to the C5 Corvette Program panels off processing methodology to replace the repair until acceptable previous process, substantially improving the quality on all Corvettes from C5 forward. c.) Working with the Ford and Chrysler Executive Engineers on the Partnership for the Next Generation of Vehicles and acting as the point man in annually reporting to the Federal Government. d.) Working with the Proctor & Gamble Company to solve a major problem on a product launch. Recognized by John Smale, CEO of P&G. e.) President of the Society of Plastics Engineers - Detroit Chapter and Chairman of the SPE Automotive Division.

AWARDS RECEIVED: Group received the Kettering Award (\$10,000.00 each) for putting patented compression molding press controls into production.

HOBBIES: Cars and more cars. Bowling, golf, softball and Indy Car Racing.

Bill has been married to Molly since 1960 (53 years) They have four children. Molly Ann is an Executive Nurse at a major hospital. William J. is an FDA food inspector. Wendy is a Real Estate Agent and Tom is an Executive Engineer and Program Manager for a major supplier to the Big Three Automakers.

Molly was born and raised in Elyria, OH. She attended Southern Seminary College in Buena Vista, VA from 1955 through 1957, earning a 2 year diploma in Education. Primarily, she prides herself as a stay at home mom for her four children.
