(Includes vendor employees, etc.) Note the lights being used to make the grass grow in shaded areas around the diamond and in right field. The grass is completely replaced every year.



Did you know that the Diamondbacks hold the major league record for becoming the fastest "expansion team" in the majors to win a World Series after being added to the league in 1998. D-Backs did it in only their 4th season. They beat the New York Yankees in Game Seven of the 2001 World Series on a Luis Gonzales walk-off hit in the ninth inning at Chase Field.

AWIM SUMMARY FOR 2013/2014 SCHOOL YEAR

A message from Don Robins, Phoenix Area AWIM Coordinator:

We just completed the 8th year of the 'A World In Motion' in Arizona. It was our best school year by far. We impacted 1956 students in 12 schools. We have been increasing the number of schools and impacted students each year. During the 2012/2013 school year we impacted 880 students. We have been so successful with the AWIM program in AZ, SAE asked us to come to the SAE Section Officers Leadership Seminar in Michigan this spring to tell our story. I attended with 2 other AWIM volunteers from AZ. The event was held at MIS in Brooklyn, MI. Some of the reasons our program is so successful is because of the support we get for GM, who supply all the materials at no cost to the schools, and the GM retirees who volunteer in the program. We also have great schools and teachers, without them we would not have an AWIM program in AZ.



March of this year, SAE presented the 2013 Gary Dickenson Award For Teaching Excellence to Karen Roscon, the AWIM teacher at Kino Junior High in Mesa. Only one teacher each year receives this award from SAE.
