This picture was taken on March 21, 2014 just 10 days before John died of a heart attack on April 1st while on a cruise to the Panama Cannel with his wife Pam. They had been praying that their time to leave this earth would come in God's timing and that they would be doing something they both loved to do. God answered their prayers. The photo depicts just how close they were and the love they shared for each other. They were true "partners" in everything they did in their lives. For this reason, we dedicate this article in John's memory.

Pam Roberts was born in Norwich, Norfolk, England. Her father died in WWII in a Japanese Prisoner of War Camp in Thailand when she was just 18 months old. Her mother married an American Army soldier when Pam was 6 years old. Her stepfather moved the family to Tennessee where they lived in a house without plumbing or electricity for some time. They were very poor and moved from house to house until Pam was 10 years old. They moved to Detroit, Michigan where she was raised. When she was 11 years old, she remembers riding her bike around the very large block of buildings that were occupied by Cadillac on Clark Street in Detroit, never thinking that one day she would work there, and they would pay for her college education and make possible the wonderful life she has today.



General Motors has been a huge part of her life. Pam was always considered to be a "brain" with "nerd potential" when growing up. She even appeared on the TV show "Wiz Kids" and excelled in answering questions. So, when she graduated from Detroit's Western High, it is no wonder that she was granted a four year college GM Scholarship for academic achievement. However, she only used one year due to the fact that she left college to get married. GM still paid her way through college using the GM Tuition Refund Program and

as a result she graduated Summa Cum Laude with a BS Degree in Business Administration with a minor in Psychology at the University of Detroit.

Pam first started at GM with Cadillac Motor Car Division as a clerk in 1962. That was one of the only positions a woman could hold in those days until the equal employment opportunity push took hold at which time she began to move forward with her career. She held many positions when starting out most of which were eventually replaced by computers. This helped focus her career in the direction computers were taking the company to run and streamline the business. Very early in the new wave of computerization, Pam was editing key punch cards for new car builds for that day to make sure they were compatible. Later, her job was to type the vehicle specifications directly to the production line. Only once could she remember making a wrong key punch stroke which resulted in having a black car built with white fenders. Obviously, she got a lot of ribbing for that error from fellow workers.

Most of Pam's supervisory and managerial career evolved around dealer computer systems...Model & Option Forecasting, Sales Reporting & Forecasting, Dealer Communications (DCS), so much so that she moved to EDS as a Staff Assistant for the Vehicle Ordering Management System (VOMS) development, initialization and implementation. She returned to Cadillac after 3 years to become the VOMS Manager and retired in 1995 at the age of 53.

As mentioned above, Pam married early in her business career and was married to her first husband for 22 years before he succumbed to Melanoma. She and her husband, Norbert Bartos, the Assistant Director of Public Relations for Cadillac, enjoyed teaching Sunday School and mentoring children in a single parent home. Pam enjoyed reading, traveling, volunteering and grandchildren. So, it was no wonder that after she was widowed God brought her a man who loved the same things...times two. John Roberts and Pam were married on September 11, 1992. Mutual friends introduced them the day after Pam had prayed for a new husband. She had prayed for a Christian man who was a widow, had children and knew how to cook! John, who was widowed twice before meeting Pam, fit this request exactly and had many more wonderful surprises. They began their lives together serving the Lord and performing missionary work around the world.



John Emlen Roberts was born in Acosta, Pennsylvania and early in his life his parents relocated to Canton, Ohio where he lived until he enlisted in the U.S. Army at the age of 18. John was a Korean War veteran and recipient of the Purple Heart. After returning from the war, John settled in Detroit, Michigan for the next 40 years. John had 4 children (two boys and two girls) and 8 grandchildren. John's life was filled with love of his family, success of his electrical contracting business, and what would be the first of his missionary work with the Detroit First Church of the Nazarene. And, like Pam, he loved

to travel, reading and to perform volunteer work.

John's first missionary calling was to build a parsonage in Swaziland. This opened his heart to God's purpose for him for the next 30 years. He came to know Jesus as his Savior on his second Work and Witness Trip in Peru, where he was baptized in a river. In all, John led over 60 mission trips to 16 countries. Pam partnered with him on over 20 of these trips from 1992 - 2013. In one 11 year period alone, they were involved in build-ing 50 small churches. In addition, countless lives have been touched in a positive way. On some occasions, the team included doctors and dentists that administered to the poor and needy at no charge.

Listed below are three or four examples of how their ministry has enriched the lives of John and Pam:


TAPACHULA, MEXICO: Eleven years ago, John and Pam were called to lead a Work and Witness team to Tapachula, Mexico, where they continued through 2013. Their mission was to build a parsonage for the pastor as well as minister and witness to the locals. What an experience.

The children were wonderful. They were very receptive to the Bible School and shared many hugs as well as receiving the gospel. The people of the church were warm and appreciative. Pam remembers once when 3 ladies in their 80's came to pray for her and other workers painting a wall. These ladies knelt on the cement with their bare knees to pray for the workers and bless them. All were in tears at the end of that heartfelt prayer.



MANY OTHER POOR CITIES AROUND THE WORLD: Teams would go and witness door to door in the poorest of neighborhoods while on their off hours from working on the building. Pam remembers one typical house she visited in Tapachula, Mexico. It was just one room, a box with 2 beds, a table and 2 chairs, nothing else. There were no doors or window glass. There were just curtains in the doorway and the one window. The team told them how much God loved them, told them about Jesus and gave them small gifts including a "salvation bracelet". The team prayed with them and asked them to come to church. These people, who had nothing, were more gracious than many Americans in the same circumstances. They insisted that the team use the two chairs and they stood. They were hungry to hear God's story. In every city visited, over time, a positive transformation in that city took place. People were given new hope.

More recently, John and Pam have volunteered their time reading to 3rd grade children, and serving the Indian Reservation community in areas of need. Spreading the word of God through compassionate ministries, building churches, parsonages and schools became their passion. Many times they supported these projects with their own money, but their greatest rewards came from actually participating. Being on the ground working, witnessing to others, administering to the sick and aiding the poor. For Pam and John, it was a blessing, not a sacrifice, to share physical and spiritual resources God has given them. They really believed they were more blessed than the receivers of their works. The two guiding verses from the Bible that directed them to minister are: Hebrews 13:16 And do not forget to do good and to share with others, for with such sacrifices God is pleased. Mark 16:15 And He said to them, "Go into all the world and proclaim the gospel to the whole creation."

Now you might think that due to losing her partner and all the grieving that she is experiencing would slow her down. Not so! In 2015, Pam already has two trips planned. First to Kenya to assist with combating gender/ work place violence. The goal is to build a "safe house" for abused women and teach the men how God wants them to treat the women. In addition, they will implement a new fresh water purification system as well as teach locals about God. Then, it is down to Rocky Point, Mexico to build churches and witness about God in order to create change. Pam also belongs to a woman's prayer group and a mixed prayer group. These groups are committed to praying for the needs of each other and those in need.



Locally, Pam belongs to the CrossRoads Nazarene Church in Chandler where she attends Sunday school classes on "Practical Christianity", helps minister at local reservation churches and, as usual, around Christmas helps her class take them lots of needed gifts. Pam helps feed the homeless in Tempe Park once a month and as-

sists other church members when the church opens its doors to the homeless once a month for a week of shelter, food and clothing.

In closing, we all can take away from this Christmas article the importance of helping others in need. No matter what faith you belong to, giving of yourself and working to help others is in many ways more important than giving just your money. People will see that you really care about them and love them and want to bless them. Pam intends to continue her walk with Jesus and trusts Him to lead her in serving Him for the rest of her life. John and Pam are living testimonies of loving the Lord with all your heart. Their Christmas story is living proof that the teachings of Jesus have shaped the entire world and continues to do so today.



John has been a rock of strength, love and comfort for his wife, children, grandchildren and friends.
