Ret. Admiral Clark
"United States'
Current
Challenges"



Admiral Clark completed a distinguished 37-year Navy career in 2005 beginning in the late 1960's through 2005. His Navy experience spans his beginning days in destroyers, early command of a Patrol Gunboat as a Lieutenant, and concluding in the halls of the Pentagon as the Chief of Naval Operations (CNO) and a member of the Joint Chiefs of Staff.

Admiral Clark became the CNO just before the Global War on Terrorism became a reality with the attack on USS COLE and 9/11. Ultimately he became the second longest serving CNO in history, and is the only Chief of any Service to be extended in office under the current legislation established by the Goldwater-Nichols Act in 1986. His number one priority was to "win the battle for the people," while leading the Navy forward into the 21st century.

He has an exceptional background to be able to share his thoughts on the "United States' Current Challenges," and from the daily news, we all know there are plenty of challenges. That should make it a *must attend* meeting!

The meeting is at Pebble Creek Eagle's Nest Ballroom, with registration beginning at 10:00 am and an open bar at 11:00 am. Lori Regnier has been a resident of Gilbert for 18 years. She is Co-Founder and Vice President of the Starbright Foundation, a local Gilbert based non-profit that serves child victims of sex trafficking and abuse.

Lori has over 30 years' experience advocating for child abuse victims. She was the recipient of the Soroptomist Ruby award and was named one of Arizona's Top Ten Women of Courage for being on the front lines in Arizona combatting the dark world of child sex trafficking. She was a guest on the Dr. Oz show with Lisa Ling, doing a special on Sex Trafficking in America after helping a local police officer's family who had their young daughter stolen and sold into trafficking.

She was also honored with the "Big O" Hero award for being a local Real Estate Agent making the most change for children in the Valley and was recently recognized with the Channel 12 News Award for her efforts in keeping children safe. She has been directly involved in the recovery of missing children taken into sex trafficking. Lori educates weekly on social media dangers and how to keep our children safe from an ever increasing dark crime against our Valley youth.

OBITUARY FOR JAMES (JIM) A. HILL JR. (1928 - 2018)



Jim Hill Jr. passed away September 2, 2018 in Scottsdale. He was a very active Club member in past years. A memorial service was held on September 22, 2018 in Belleville, Kansas.

Jim had a great passion for anything on four wheels. He was employed by the Melton Motor car dealership for 16 years before being hired by the General Motors Corporation, and working his way up to an executive position as heavy duty truck sales manager in charge of U.S. fleet sales. Throughout his career, he mentored several employees that carried his knowledge and spark for leadership into the next generation. On his way up the ladder with GM, he earned the distinction of becoming the youngest zone manager in the company's history. Jim arranged for the first truck ever to be used as a pace car at the Indianapolis 500, as well as providing trucks to movie studios. Jim and his wife, Joyce, hosted many GM functions in both the U.S. and abroad throughout the years.

After retiring in 1987, Jim branched out into the real estate business while remaining active as a consultant for many car and truck operations. Jim is survived by a daughter, Barbara, of Overland Park, KS and son, Douglas, of Scottsdale.
