There is **still time to register** for the January 16<sup>th</sup> meeting at the East Valley Institute of Technology Culinary Institute (EVIT). Lori Regnier will be speaking on "Human Trafficking Prevention... Keeping Our Children Safe."

This is a current hot topic and touches more people than we might realize. Come to learn more about what we can do to help protect our family members. Registration begins at 10:30 am, with the speaker at 11:00 am, and lunch to follow. Cost is \$22.00 for members and spouse/significant others and \$27.00 for non-members for the meal and presentation. **Registration is due by January 7, 2019**.

Lori Regnier has been a resident of Gilbert for 18 years. She is Co-Founder and Vice President of the Starbright Foundation, a local Gilbert based non-profit that serves child victims of sex trafficking and abuse.

Lori has over 30 years' experience advocating for child abuse victims and was the recipient of the Soroptomist Ruby award. She was named one of Arizona's Top Ten Women of Courage for being on the front lines in Arizona combatting the dark world of child sex trafficking. Lori was a guest on the Dr. Oz show with Lisa Ling, on "Sex Trafficking in America" after helping a local police officer's family who had their young daughter stolen and sold into trafficking.

She was also honored with the "Big O" Hero award for being a local Real Estate Agent making the most change for children in the Valley and was recently recognized with the Channel 12 News Award for her efforts in keeping children safe. Lori has been directly involved in the recovery of missing children taken into sex trafficking. She educates weekly on social media dangers and how to keep our children safe from an ever-increasing dark crime against our Valley youth.

In 1964, Roberts started developing a musical variety act, playing more than a dozen instruments and singing. He began impersonating stars after hearing that he sounded or looked like them. Roberts' favorite impersonations are Bob Hope, Jack Benny, and Red Skelton among others. Lynn won a Cloney Award for his impersonation and tribute to Bob Hope in 2006. For the past 16 years, he has been touring the U.S. and Canada doing his tributes. #### OBITUARY FOR JAMES MAXWELL (1934 - 2018)




James Maxwell, 84, passed away on November 25, 2018, and is survived by his 3 children, 7 grandchildren, and 2 great-grandchildren. His wife of 42 years, Doris, predeceased him in 2002. Jim was born in Flushing, NY, and graduated from GMI in 1956 with a BSME. After retiring from GMC Truck following a 30-year career with General Motors, Jim started Maxwell Enterprises in Wexford, PA, where he instructed first responders in the efficient deployment of airbags in emergency situations. After closing Maxwell Enterprises, he became an active member of the GM Alumni Club of AZ while living the life of a snowbird for 16 years. During this time he mentored promising Phoenix high school students through STEM projects sponsored by AWIM and the GM Alumni Club.
