# MEET OUR NEW VICE PRESIDENT - KEN WECHSELBERGER

Welcome Vice President, Ken Wechselberger. As a former President of our club, Ken brings a wealth of experience to the recently vacated position of Vice President. Ken has volunteered to serve in the capacity of Vice President and on the club's board for the balance of 2019.

Ken was born and raised in Chicago, Illinois. He is the oldest of three boys and was always active while growing up, whether it was wrestling in the City Park Championship or winning the Chicago BSA Patrick Henry Public Speaking contest. He attended Steinmetz High School and made his mark as the Sports Editor for the Steinmetz Star until graduating in 1964.

Studies at Wright Junior College, then North Park College, were completed in 1968 with a major in Business Administration and minors in Mathematics and English Literature. His fondest college memory surrounded Senior Spring Break in Florida. Ken also received an MBA degree from Loyola University, Chicago in 1970.

During and briefly after college, Ken worked for US Electrical Motors, A Division of Emerson Electric, until General Motors, Chevrolet Division, hired him on February 3, 1969. Over his forty-year career with GM, Ken relocated nineteen times passing through Chicago, Milwaukee, Detroit, New York, Tokyo, Minneapolis, Boston, Dallas, Los Angeles and Shanghai... (whew!!!).

He held various Chevrolet, Buick and corporate line sales and marketing staff positions; District Sales Manager, Regional Manager, Assistant General Sales Manager, VSSM Regional Sales Manager and Director of Marketing for GM International, as a few examples.

A fond memory, early in Ken's career, was when he was assigned to work with the Chevrolet Small Car school in Wilmington, Delaware which trained 6000 retail dealership salespersons. The size and magnitude of the assignment not only made a lasting impression in Ken's mind, it ultimately served as a "spring board" to major job assignments.

Another fond memory, which took place during his assignment in Japan, was climbing Mt. Fuji overnight, arriving at the summit above the clouds at 4:15 a.m. to watch the sun rise and shout "Bonsai!!" As it turned out, Japan was a wonderful experience for all the Wechselbergers, but Ken remembers his family in tears at the dinner table when announcing they were moving to Japan and subsequently his family again in tears when announcing they were moving back to the United States.

It takes a very understanding person to move onaverage every two years during her husband's career. And that's where Joyce Lynn comes in. Ken luckily met Joyce on a "blind date" in 1964 and they married in 1968. Joyce was also born and raised in Chicago. She has an older brother and a twin sister.




Joyce enjoys pickleball and quilting which has been her passion for over 35 years. As a matter of fact, Joyce is the proud owner of the largest quilting machine that

# OBITUARY FOR LAMONT LEE CORP (1927 - 2019)

As reported previously, a past member of the Club, Lamont Lee Corp, passed away on January 28th in Las Vegas, NV, at the age of 91.

Lamont was born in Saginaw, MI, and spent his 33-year GM career at the Chevrolet Grey Iron Foundry in Saginaw, retiring as General Superintendent of production in 1986. Following two years in the Navy at the end of WWII, Lamont returned home and started his own dance band (*Lamont Corp & His Orchestra*) in 1947. Music was one of his greatest loves in life, having attended the Interlochen Music School in Michigan in 1944 as first trumpet.

Following his retirement from GM, Lamont split his time between Scottsdale, AZ, and L'Anse, MI. While in AZ, he became involved in the GM Retiree Club of AZ. In 2004 he

moved to Wickenburg, AZ full-time, becoming very socially involved and a member of the Chamber of Commerce before illness forced him to move to Las Vegas in 2015 to be with his daughter.

Lamont's greatest love was his wife of almost 50 years, Monalou, who predeceased him. He is survived by his son and daughter, 3 grandchildren, 2 step-grandchildren, and 3 great grandchildren.



# 2020 SPECIAL EVENT PLANNED FOR FEBRUARY 2020






