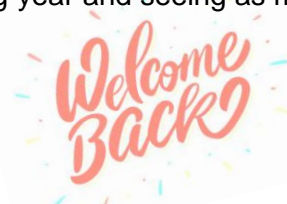

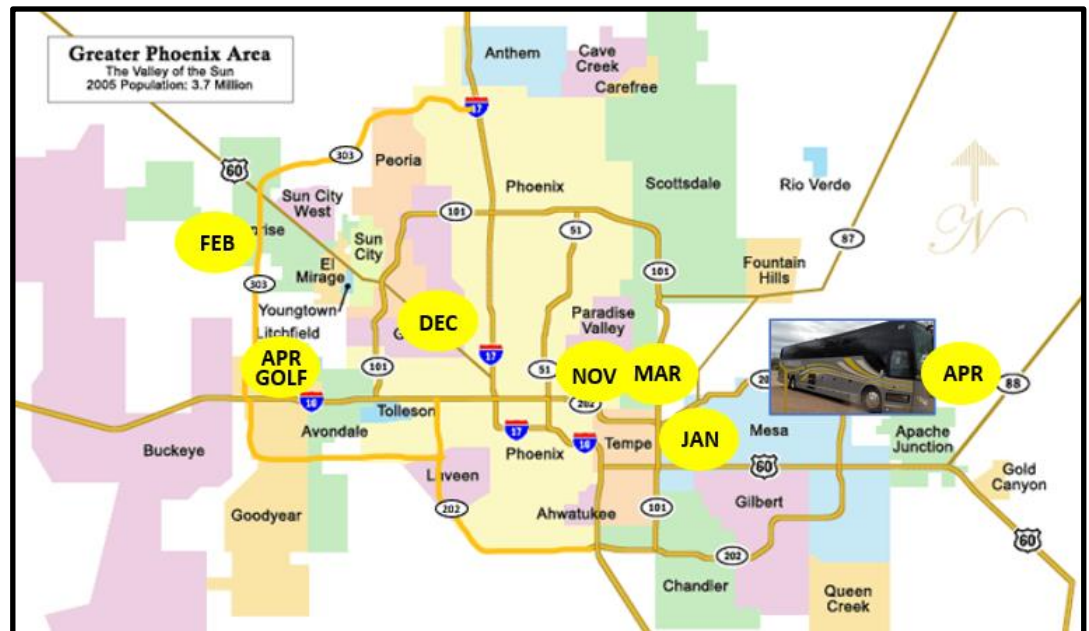

Hall of Flame – Firefighting Museum

Monday, November 16, 2020



The Hall of Flame was founded in 1961 in Wisconsin and moved to its current location in Phoenix in 1974. The Hall has grown from its original single gallery to five exhibit galleries, the National Firefighting Hall of Heroes, the museum store, a theater, a restoration shop, a collection storage building, and administrative offices.

The Hall's present size is 70,000 square feet, with 35,000 square feet of exhibit galleries. The collection has grown to over 130 wheeled pieces and thousands of smaller artifacts. The galleries contain a wide variety of exhibits, including fire apparatus, artwork, uniforms and equipment, firemarks, alarm room equipment, and a large fire safety exhibit which includes a two room safety house, a mini-theater, and many hands-on exhibits for children.

In 1998 the museum opened the National Firefighting Hall of Heroes. In this gallery we honor American firefighters who have received a national award for heroism, and we also recognize American firefighters who have died in the line of duty.

Speaking on "Fake News"

Gail Rhodes will explain the origins of fake news, how to spot it, and how the term has evolved to mean "negative news" or "news with which I disagree."


People have been using words – both written and spoken – to inform others for as long as people have been communicating. Propaganda, writing to distort the truth to drive action, has been around almost as long, but wasn't used on a large scale until the last century, when it was used to motivate citizens to action during both World Wars.

While propaganda was largely the product of government agencies, the advent of the internet and social media has dramatically changed the landscape. Unlike propaganda in the past, fake news today can reach a large audience with little effort, because of social media and the ability to create a blog or website for little or no cost.

Fake news is not the product of legitimate news outlets. Rather, they are stories that appear to be written as legitimate news, but have no basis in facts and are created with a particular goal in mind.

Gail will explore how fake news is being used today to affect major events, She will also explore how fake news could be curbed and how to become a better consumer, by knowing how to spot fake news.

Rhodes worked in television as an anchor and reporter for 20 years, before enrolling in ASU's master and doctorate programs in journalism and mass communication. Her thesis explores the First Amendment and the NFL national anthem protests.

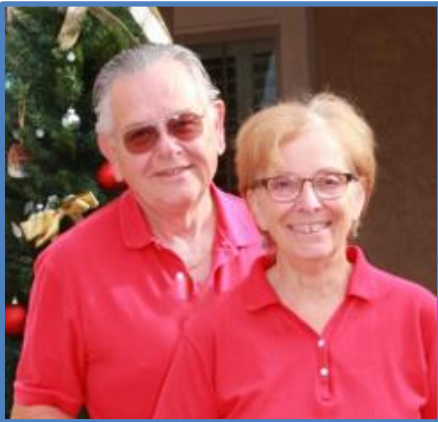

MEET CLUB MEMBERS – TREVOR & ROSE MARTIN

As the Club preamble states, Club members “enjoy good times with friends, new and old...” So, it’s time to learn more about two of our members, **Trevor and Rose Martin**, as new and deeper friendships are being formed.



Trevor was born in Littlebury, England, and emigrated to the United States with his mother at the age of three. Upon their arrival at Ellis Island, they immediately traveled to White Cloud, Michigan, a small community located 50 miles north of

Grand Rapids, where they reunited with their father and husband. At the age of 11, the family moved to Houghton Lake, Michigan, where they resided until Trevor was 16, when the family again moved to Richmond, Michigan. Trevor was the oldest of three children. He had a younger brother, Colin, and a younger sister, Elise.

Trevor attended Houghton Lake High School from freshman through junior year and St. Augustine High School in Richmond for his senior year. His performance in high school led to membership in the National Honor Society and receipt of a Michigan Merit Scholarship award. While attending St. Augustine High School, a friend set him up on a blind date with a fellow senior, Rose Beaufait, and as they say, “The rest is history!”

Following high school graduation in 1962, Rose attended Siena Heights College in Adrian, Michigan, while Trevor went north to Michigan College of Mining and Technology (known today as Michigan Technological University) in Houghton, Michigan on the Keweenaw Peninsula into Lake Superior. Although they were physically 700 miles apart, they remained together. Rose graduated in 1966 with a Bachelor of Philosophy/Education degree and Trevor graduated in 1967 with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Chemistry. Rose and Trevor were married in Romeo, Michigan, on June 29, 1968.

Trevor began his working career with Uniroyal Tire in

Detroit, Michigan, where he worked as a Development Engineer on truck and aircraft tires from 1967 through 1979. While working at Uniroyal Tire, he also attended Wayne State University in Detroit and graduated with a Masters in Business Administration degree in 1972.

In March 1979, Trevor began his GM career and joined the GM Engineering Staff. While at GM, he worked at Tire and Wheel Systems (light truck tire development), Durability Test and Development (Competitive Assessment), Noise and Vibration (Squeak and Rattle), Advanced Vehicle Development and Vehicle Closures Development. Trevor spent two years as an ISP (International Service Personnel) at Opel in Germany, where he worked as a Squeak and Rattle consultant and as a Vehicle Development Engineer responsible for the Opel Astra Coupe and Convertible. His GM career ended with his retirement in April 2007.

Upon graduation from Siena Heights College, Rose entered the workforce as a 3rd grade teacher in St. Clair Shores Lakeshore District. She taught for three years before taking 10 years off to be a stay-at-home mom. She returned to teaching in 1983 as a 3rd grade teacher in the Linden Community School District. She taught 3rd grade until 1998 when she took a leave of absence to accompany Trevor in Germany during his ISP assignment with GM. She returned to teaching in the fall of 1999 as an elementary Art Teacher and continued that until she retired in 2009.

Family has been very important to Rose and Trevor throughout their 53 years of marriage. They are more in love now than ever. They have three wonderful children; Joel is the oldest, Todd is the middle child and Elizabeth is the youngest. They are grandparents of 11 and great grandparents of three. The grandchildren range in age from 3 years old to 32 years old and the great grandchildren range in age from 2 years to 6 years. Trevor’s parents and brother, Colin, are deceased, while his sister, Elise, lives in Bradenton, Florida.

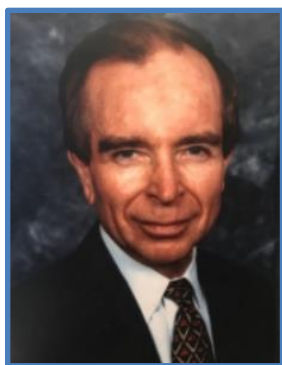
