MEET CLUB MEMBERS - RON & SHERRI TERRY

This month we continue to get to know our Club members better by featuring *Ron and Sherri Terry*. Ron has recently joined the Board of Directors as a Sub-Director, and the Club welcomes him on-board with his fresh ideas and broad experiences.



Ron was born in Youngstown, Ohio, in 1956 as the youngest of two boys in the family. During his younger years, his family did a lot of camping and traveling. One of those trips was a

trip out west in 1966, which prompted the family to eventually decide to move to Arizona. When Ron was in the 8th grade, the family packed up and moved west. With the move to Phoenix, Ron then attended and graduated from Cortez High School in 1974, where he had the honor of becoming a member of the National Honor Society. A favorite pastime and hobby during these years was flying model airplanes with friends, when not busy at school, working on his paper route, or working at Jack in the Box.

Looking ahead toward his college days, Ron submitted his application to General Motors Institute (now Kettering University) with the hope of being sponsored by one of GM's California assembly plants. With 1974 being a tough year for new sponsorships, his interviews with the Southgate and Fremont facilities were unsuccessful. Fortunately, prior to his High School graduation during a vacation back to Ohio, Ron was able to get an interview with the student coordinator at Packard Electric. Within a month he received a sponsorship from Packard Electric, and his dad was driving him back to Flint to begin the cooperative college life at GMI.

While pursuing a Mechanical Engineering Degree at GMI, Ron was active in the Sigma Nu fraternity and car club. During his fourth year, he had a project assignment of turbocharging a Pontiac Firebird which was presented to Pontiac and went into production in 1979.

Upon graduation from GMI with a BME in Automotive

Engineering in 1979, Ron started at Packard Electric in Ohio as a validation test engineer for EMC (electromagnetic compatibility) of the upcoming airbag and engine control computer systems. He later moved into an application engineer assignment, which resulted in the family's move to Flint, Michigan in 1986 to be part of a new initiative to locate suppliers at the car divisions.

While in Ohio, Ron met a young lady, Sherri Kiefer, at a wedding each happened to be attending. relationship grew to the point of being married in April 1985. An interesting discovery was that Sherri had been born in the same Youngstown, Ohio hospital by the same doctor as was Ron, only three years later. Sherri grew up in the Youngstown area and attended Austintown Fitch High School. During her senior year, she was in the COE program (Cooperative Office Education), where she went to school half a day and worked as a secretary the other half. Sherri then had the opportunity to work at many different offices and take off time when their son, Brandon, was born in December of 1992. Brandon lives with Ron and Sherri and works at Home Depot. The cooperative education programs were very good to both Ron and Sherri.

In 1990, Ron transferred from Packard Electric to the BOC Flint Group and worked in the Electrical Software and Systems Group. This began Ron's exposure to many different vehicle electronic systems - navigation,

remote keyless entry, body computers, and HVAC systems. In 1988, he led the launch of the OnStar Gen 3 system into the factory (rather than being a dealer installed option) for both car and truck groups. Ron was also a member of the team that created and launched the OnStar Turn by Turn Navigation System. In 2008, that team was selected to receive one of the annual GM President's Awards - recognition of the best of the best ideas and projects from around the corporation. Ron was honored to participate in the recognition ceremony at the GM Heritage Center where the awards were presented by Rick Wagoner.



These assignments led to him leading the group responsible for developing the OnStar hardware globally. New innovations developed during this time included the introduction of Bluetooth (Gen 8 MY09), OnStar China (MY10), and 4G LTE wi-fi connectivity (Gen 10 MY15). Before his retirement in 2017, Ron also worked on development of a connectivity system for autonomous vehicles, preparing for the future. It was during this assignment in February 2017 that Ron and Sherri moved to Arizona, where Ron worked out of the GM Phoenix software group office before

retiring later that year in September.

They are now enjoying their hobbies and retirement. Ron enjoys woodworking, radio-controlled cars, and tinkering (i.e., trying to fix almost anything electrical!), while Sherri enjoys reading, shopping with friends and vacationing when she can.
