

November 2021



The February Meeting will be held at the **Western Spirit**: **Scottsdale's Museum of the West**, with lunch at **Buca de Beppo** – a restaurant within one block of the Museum. The 43,000 square-foot museum offers an encyclopedia of Western art, from a rare display of Hopi ceramics to lifelike bronze statues of Native Americans by John Coleman. Western and Native American art and artifacts will connect you to the West – past, present. and future.
