During her tenure, she launched a successful second location and grew a startup into an award-winning program serving more than 300 tens annually.

Roschke has developed curriculum and taught journalism, digital media production and media literacy courses at the high school and university level for 15 years. She co-taught a digital media literacy massive open online course (MOOC) with Dan Gillmon, which served as the basis for her doctoral dissertation at the Cronkite School. She earned her Ph.D. in May 2018.

February 8, 2022


