The Heard Museum sets the standard for collaborating with American Indian artists and tribal communities to provide a distinctive perspective about the art of Native people, especially those from the Southwest.



We're pleased to share with you a bit of their history this month. It's fascinating, as are all the member interviews to-date. I know you will enjoy reading this as much as I did.

Bill grew up in Allan, Saskatchewan, Canada. While in high school, Bill played football, performed in various plays, and earned honors in Science, Chemistry, Physics, and English. He attended college at the Royal Military College of Canada in Kingston, Ontario.




His military training included Basic & Advanced Parachute, Winter Warfare, Arctic Warfare, and Demolition Instruction, with Guided Missile Training and Intelligence School in the U.S.

After leaving the Royal Canadian Military College, Bill entered the Army where he served until late 1963. His first posting was as Garrison Administrative Officer in Dawson Creek, British Columbia, Canada, then part of the Northwest (Alaska) Highway and administered by Department of National Defense (DND). While there, he met and

married the lovely Ruby Dirks, originally from Vancouver, BC, a nurse at the Red Cross outpost hospital in the area. They recently celebrated their 65th wedding anniversary.

After Dawson Creek, Bill and Ruby were transferred to Camp Borden, Ontario. While there, Bill continued coursework in Parachuting, Demolition Instructor training, and Transportation, to name a few. He performed operational assignments in Europe, Africa, U.S., and Canada.

In February 1964, Bill accepted a position with General Motors as field representative with their Motors Insurance Corporation (MIC). After receiving training Automotive in Engineering and Management at the General Motors Institute (GMI) in Flint, MI, he worked out of Toronto, Montreal, and St. John, New Brunswick in various field. and sales. service assignments. Ruby continued her career as a nurse, working in several nursing positions during these years. In 1967, they returned to Toronto when Bill was appointed Supervisor of Field Operations.

They moved to Richmond, VA in 1968 when Bill received his first management appointment. Next, they went to Dallas, TX,

where Bill became a member of the GM Regional Staff responsible for branch audits through the Southwestern U.S. Ruby continued working in nursing and was on staff at the Southern Methodist University (SMU) in the Student Health Facility where she thoroughly enjoyed attending to the health needs of the young university students.

In 1972, Bill and Ruby moved to New Rochelle, NY, when Bill was appointed to the Future Planning Staff at the GM HQ in Manhattan. Two years later, he went to Rochester, NY, as the field branch manager and, in 1980, he returned to Toronto as Manager Field Operations for Canada.

The Boechlers moved back to the U.S. in 1986 when Bill became Regional Manager, Western U.S. His office was in the GM Headquarters building in Detroit, MI. In 1989, Bill was elected an officer of the corporation and he retired as a Vice-President in 1994.

During Bill's time with GM, he successfully completed management programs at the masters level at the Wharton School of Business Management -- University of Pennsylvania and the Kellogg School of Management at Northwestern University in Evanston, Illinois. Ruby's out-going nature made it easy for her to find interesting work and volunteer opportunities along the way.

Bill's exceptional skills include alpine ski racing, and a ski instructor/ski patroller for many years, with experience in mountain rescue. Before leaving Canada, Bill was a

Vice-President of the Canadian Ski Patrol system and a member of the Canadian Ski Instructors Alliance. He has skied in Switzerland, Austria, Germany, and France, as well as in most of the major ski areas in Canada and the U.S. He enjoyed skiing, preferring Whistler, BC and Taos, NM, until knee joint replacement would end his time on the slopes.


Upon retiring, Bill and Ruby chose to divide their time between Phoenix, AZ and Bellingham, WA. They continue to enjoy travel, keeping in touch with family and friends, and their many hobbies and interests. 
On Wednesday, February 8, 2023, Ruby & Bill participated in the Club's gathering at the Musical Instrument Museum, Phoenix, AZ.


