Some Lessons Learned about Animal Traits and Behaviors





Covote:

- Live throughout Arizona and in every state except Hawaii
- Weigh 15 30 pounds
- Eat whatever is available
- Breed every year
- May be seen in groups (packs) or alone
- Removing them from one area generally results in others moving in

Javelina:

- Weigh 40 60 pounds
- Stand about 19 inches tall
- Have very poor eyesight and may appear to be charging when actually trying to escape
- Have a keen sense of smell
- Travel in washes and areas with dense vegetation
- Will roll in mud and water to cool off
- Have a scent gland on back used to identify animals from different herds
- Are most active at night



Mountain Lion:

- Specialized predator also called pumas, cougars, or panthers
- Between 2,500 and 3,500 live in Arizona
- Weigh 70 150 pounds with males being larger
- · Primarily eat deer, but also javelina, bighorn sheep, elk, and occasionally pets
- Typically stalk and ambush prey from high vantage points like trees or rocks
- Average litter of three kittens, who have black spots
- · Secretive, sly, and elusive prefer to remain hidden
- Found throughout Arizona
- · Range from Canada to South America
