
November 8, 2023

50TH ANNIVERSARY SPECIAL ENTERTAINMENT

We are happy to introduce the Special Entertainment for the Club's 50th Anniversary Celebration – the band, **Gold Rush**. They will share their talent while we dine and perform with vocals thereafter. Their sound is best described as "Americana", a blending of sounds from the musical worlds of rock, folk, country, bluegrass, rhythm & blues, and other influential sources. *Gold Rush* is a fun, lively band who perform songs you know – and some you may not.

The Club's contact with the group is Jeff Rose, a long-time resident of Manistee County in Michigan and now an Arizona resident as well. As learned from information gathered through various media outlets, including: *"The Manistee News"*, and *"Bluegrass Today"*, Jeff is a quiet man by nature – he lets his music do his talking.

The master musician plays the mandolin and provides both lead and harmony vocals for the nationally-recognized bluegrass band, previously known as "Detour", now known as the "Gold Rush Trio." Jeff has toured over 20 years with "Iowa Rose", "The High Canyon Ramblers", and "The Porkypines."

He has also led numerous workshops on songwriting, mandolin, and guitar technique. And he is one of the reigning International Bluegrass Music Association golf champions.

Mr. Rose grew up listening to the Grand Ole Opry every Saturday night. Whenever bluegrass would come on, he loved it. His grandparents moved to Manistee County Michigan from Eastern Kentucky, so he feels bluegrass is in his blood.

He started playing the guitar when he was ten years old. His dad and brother, Jon, taught him a few chords. And his mom would let him out of his turn of washing the dishes if he would play the guitar for her. In high school, he started jamming with other people, and once he played in a band, he was hooked on the performance side of music. He plays guitar, mandolin, dobro (slide resophonic guitar), fiddle, bass, and banjo. Although he plays the mandolin with the Gold Rush Trio, the guitar will always be his favorite.

Over the years he's written many songs based on things that have happened or resonate with him, not based on a schedule or a plan. On one occasion he heard a story on the radio about soldiers home from war. There were more than 600 homeless veterans in Northern Michigan. And that brought Jeff to tears on how they couldn't find a job in this land they had been been fighting for.

So, he was inspired to write a song. The timing of this inspiration was incredible as he had been asked to play for the Veteran's Day ceremony in Manistee. So, he wrote the song, "Homeless of the Brave" on the way to the ceremony and called his lead singer, Missy Armstrong, and sang it into her


MEMBERSHIP RENEWALS DUE NOVEMBER 1

OBITUARY FOR ROBERT "BOB" SMITH (1931 - 2023)



Robert "Bob" Smith, long-time Club member, passed away peacefully on April 26, 2023, at age 91 in The Woodlands, Texas. Bob was born in Flint, Michigan, where he graduated from General Motors Institute (now Kettering University) with a BS Degree in Mechanical Engineering. Bob started his GM career at Chevrolet and retired from the GM Technical Center after a successful 36-year career. He was a specialist in accident investigation/reconstruction and was a pioneer in auto safety, being invaluable to legal staff involved with accident litigation.

His second wife, Jeanette, preceded him in passing away in 2022. Bob's obituary can be found at <u>Robert Smith Obituary (neptunesociety.com)</u>. This month we continue to get to know our Club members better by featuring an interview Roxanne Steffe conducted with long-time member Delrene Buterakos, who also serves at our Reception Table for Club events.

I was born in Minnesota. But when I was two years old my family moved to Flushing, Township Michigan. I graduated from Beecher High School, near Flushing. I was involved in many school activities and received an excellent education.

Three months after graduating from high school with honors, I turned 18 and hired

into GM for office work. Fortunately, I had taken many business classes while in high school. My first position was a typist and stenographer.

I met my husband, Gus Buterakos, also from the Flint area at a YMCA dance. At age 20, we were married in 1963. Our first child, Todd was born in 1966, with our youngest, Chris. born in 1968. We were also blessed with two bonus grandsons, Kyle and Ryan, and



two great grandchildren Avery and Asher.

When our eldest, Todd, was two-years-old, and Chris was born, I left General Motors to be at-home with the children. In addition to the responsibilities of Gus' job, he was also on the zoning board for our community. So it was a big help to the family for me to handle the responsibilities at-home. At that time, Gus was employed by a bank and

promoted to branch manager. We all remember, years ago, how notoriously underpaid bank employees were, so I knew I would eventually have to go back to work.

I was very fortunate to have my parents living nearby. I had the perfect sitters for my sons and their grandparents loved having them. So I took the opportunity to increase my skills and enrolled at a local college (The University of Michigan – Flint), and earned a Bachelor of Arts with Distinction.

After a 10-year hiatus, I was hired back into GM starting in a clerical position. But my Bachelor's degree and life experiences led to many promotions. I was now motivated to enroll in graduate school, which GM paid for. I remain very thankful for the opportunities to work in various departments to "broaden my experience."

My final position, as a Senior Engineer, in GM's Worldwide Facilities Group was by far my favorite. This group worked with people and departments in their relocations. GM provided me with specialized training in Computer Aided Design (CAD) and Computer Aided Manufacturing (CAM) at the General Motors Institute, learning how to design and produce blueprints for office layouts. Looking back it's easy for me to see how my career evolved through the many exceptional resources GM provided to me and to so many others.

Gus later accepted a position with the Genesee County Community Mental Health

Department as a Service Director. He said some days he wasn't quite sure which side of the desk he was on—ha ha. Gus enjoyed his career and the aspects of helping those in the community and he was promoted to Administrator.

We were now living in Fenton, MI, a great community for raising a family. We bought a home on Silver Lake, a private all-sports lake about 310 acres in size. Our family thoroughly enjoyed the fun and social activities of living on the lake.

In 2001, Gus finally retired, and I (with 31 years of broken service) retired from General Motors. We went to the Caribbean, Hawaiian Islands, and cruised to Greece, three years in a row. We continued to travel until Gus' death in 2011.

The Arizona Capitol Museum utilizes historic artifacts, guided interpretation, virtual resources, interactive activities, and public programs to educate visitors on Arizona's governmental, political, and social history. The building was dedicated in 1901 and was designated a museum in 1977. It was the actual state capitol building when Arizona became the 48th state of the United States in 1912. Join the Club to learn more about the Arizona government from territorial times to statehood to the present day. Also enjoy a true Mexican lunch at the 61-year-old La Canasta "Capitolio" Restaurant known for its Sonoran Style dishes.






