

2023 - 2024 PROGRAM YEAR EVENTS

The 2023 – 2024 Program Year has an appealing mix of events – interesting speakers and tours, an always enjoyable dinner theater performance, and a special 50th Anniversary Celebration. Presented below are details as finalized to date for these events. **Note** particularly the **Registration Deadlines** for each of these events so you will not miss out.



The November event is a **free tour** of the **Arizona Capitol Museum** with lunch purchased individually at the La Canasta "Capitolio" restaurant within two blocks of the museum. A **Registration Form** can be found on **pages 13 and 14** or by <u>clicking here</u>. Registration Forms are due by <u>October 31. 2023</u>.

The Arizona Capitol Museum was originally built to house the Territorial Government. When Arizona became a state in 1912, it housed the three branches of the new Arizona State Government on its four floors. As the state expanded, the branches relocated to adjacent buildings and additions. The 1901 portion of the Capitol is now maintained as the **Arizona Capitol Museum** with a focus on the history and culture of Arizona.



Museum exhibits focus on the evolution of Arizona from Territory to State. There are over 20 exhibits featuring contemporary, historical and artifacts from the Arizona state-owned collections. Permanent exhibits include the sinking of USS *Arizona*, the formal silver service from USS *Arizona*, a timeline of events pivotal in making Arizona a state, the Governor and Secretary of State's original offices, and the historical senate and house.

The Governor's office on the second floor includes artifacts from several of Arizona's governors, as well as a flag used by Teddy Roosevelt's Rough Riders.

PROGRAM YEAR EVENTS (CONT'D) 2023 - 2024



One impressive display shows the enormous silver and copper punchbowl service from the USS Arizona, as well as a bronze sculpture that was ensconced outside the Admiral's stateroom and used as a centerpiece at state dinners wherever the USS Arizona was docked. Both of these historical artifacts survived the sinking of the USS Arizona because they had been removed from the ship for cleaning prior to the attack on Pearl Harbor. The punchbowl service is the only one of its kind and is composed of etched copper panels depicting desert scenes set into a silver bowl ornamented with mermaids, dolphins, waves, and other nautical themes.

Join us as we enjoy these exhibits and many more.






For those of you who attended our April 2022 event at Martin's, you already know that the museum far exceeded our expectations. It is with great pleasure that we were able to secure the

The building was dedicated in 1901 and was designated a museum in 1977. It was the actual state capitol building when Arizona became the 48th state of the United States in 1912. 
