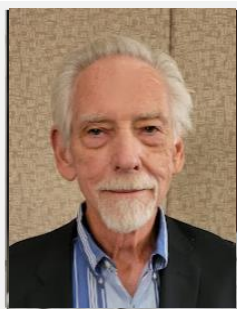

Wonderful Years!

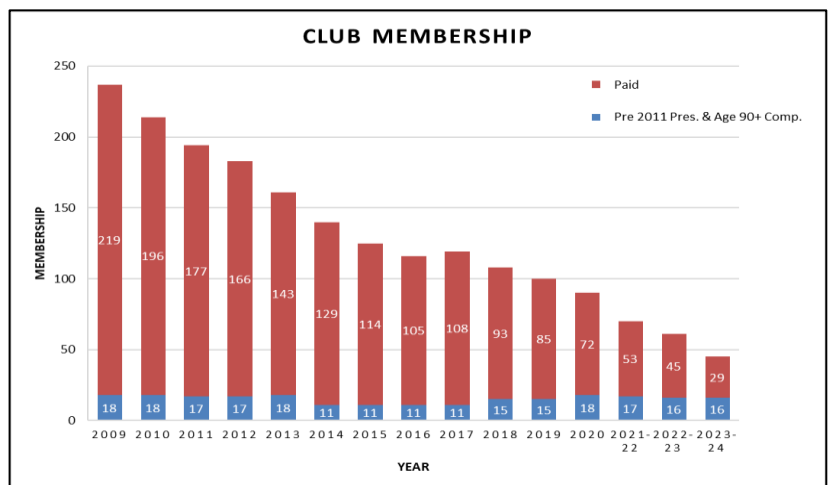

MEET TEDDY ROOSEVELT AS PORTRAYED BY JOSEPH WIEGAND

Teddy Roosevelt was born in New York City, New York on October 27, 1858. He graduated Phi Beta Kappa and Magna Cum Laude from Harvard University and was the youngest elected member of the New York General Assembly.

In the years to follow, he became a cattle rancher in the Dakota Territory and ran unsuccessfully for the New York mayorship. He served as a United States Civil Service Commissioner, President of the Police Commission of New York City, Assistant Secretary of the United States Navy, Colonel of the 1st United States Volunteer Cavalry, Governor of New York, Vice-President and President of the United States, all by the age of 42.

He was the father of six children and the author of over thirty books. He was a big game hunter, a leading ornithologist (a person who studies birds), and the founder of Boone & Crockett, the nation's first fair-hunting and conservation organization. During his presidency, he declared some 230 million acres to be designated as national parks, national forests, wildlife refuges, and national monuments. He was, indeed, the great conservation president.

Spend an afternoon with Joe Wiegand and his an in-character presentation of Teddy Roosevelt. You will learn how Teddy Roosevelt shaped our nation's history through who he was and how his leadership & activism was a natural outgrowth of his life experience. His larger-than-life personality helped him in many ways to become one of the most respected and successful Presidents of the greatest nation in the world.

ABOUT MR. WIEGAND:

Joe Wiegand is a political science graduate of The University of the South in Sewanee, Tennessee. Twice elected to head Sewanee's student government, Joe had earlier been elected Governor of the American Legion Illinois Boys State and President of the American Legion Boys Nation programs. Wiegand served as a graduate assistant at the Center for Governmental Studies at Northern Illinois University in DeKalb, Illinois, before launching his own business as a political campaign consultant and public policy expert. He has been named a Wilkins Scholar, a Harry S. Truman Scholar, and a Thomas J. Watson Fellow. He served six years as a member of the DeKalb County, Illinois Board of Commissioners. Joe was working in public policy and running election campaigns when he began performing as Theodore Roosevelt in 2002.

Wiegand lives in Medora, North Dakota, and he works for the Theodore Roosevelt Medora Foundation. He is a thirty-year member of Rotary International and a member of the National Association for Interpretation. His performance tour is highlighted in summer by a daily matinee in Medora, gateway to Theodore Roosevelt National Park and future home of Theodore Roosevelt Presidential Library.

Falcon Field is used to preserve and showcase unique WWII warbirds, while keeping many in running order today. Hear nostalgic, inspirational stories as the docent leads the group through the collection of artifacts and exhibits. Walk through a working hangar and watch aircraft mechanics bring powerful engines to life. Learn how aircraft evolved as a vital partner to ground and sea operations from WWI to the present.

The museum encompasses 60,000 square feet of exhibit area, and typically features 15 aircraft in the main exhibit area (representing WWI thru Vietnam eras) and six operational aircraft either outdoors or in the maintenance hangar, with the possibility of touring the inside of a B-17 Flying Fortress bomber developed in the 1930s or a C-47 military transport aircraft used during WWII.

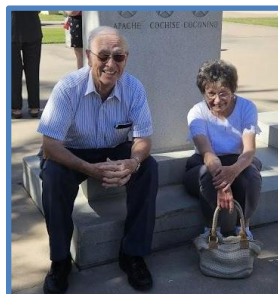
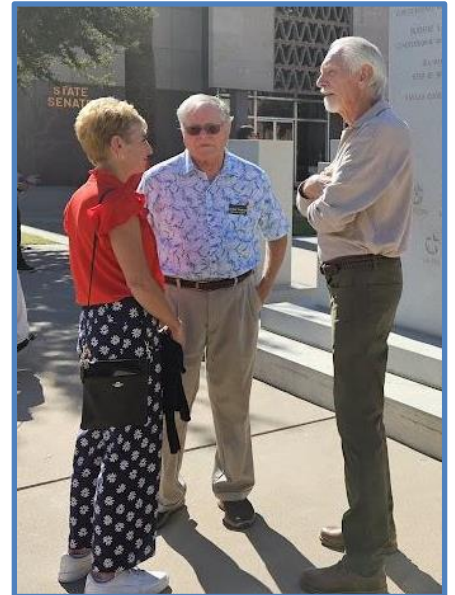
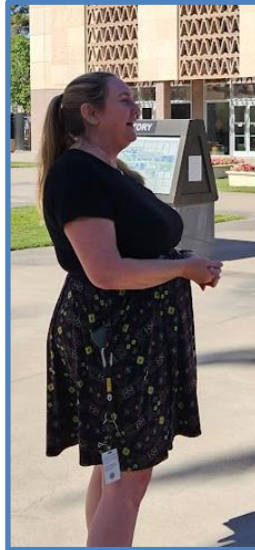
NOVEMBER 8, 2023 – ARIZONA CAPITOL MUSEUM TOUR
